


The Salem Witch Trials

- Worried about people pulling away from their religion
 - (non-conformity could mean disaster)
- Many accused of witchcraft were otherwise looked down on by society
 - (people who were homeless, lower class, female, or had a mental disability)




- The Holocaust

The Red Scare & Joseph McCarthy

 - Period in the 1950s. American Democracy felt threatened by USSR Communism.

Arthur Miller

- Born in Harlem, New York in 1915
- Wrote *The Crucible* in 1953, comparing the current McCarthy Trials to the 1692 Salem Witch Trials
- Refused to testify against any of his Hollywood or Broadway colleagues, and was found in contempt of court
