

# What's truly important?

 Proctor: "I labor the earth from dawn of day to blink of night, and I tell you true, when I look to heaven and see my money glaring at his elbows – it hurt my prayer, sir" (65)

- Greed corrupts, blind faith isn't enough

- Elizabeth: "I cannot think the Devil may own a woman's soul, Mr. Hale, when she keeps an upright way, as I have. I am a good woman, I know it; and if you believe I may do only good work in the world and yet be secretly bound to Satan, then I must tell you, sir, I do not believe it" (70)
  - A good life based on feelings is more important than rule-based qualifications
